Grouping and ordering evidence search results on KnowledgeShare

The latest update focused on functionality to allow more autonomy when grouping and ordering results in the evidence search report.

Replacing result types, the new *sections* provide headers for search results. The default sections are:

Sections can be edited, renamed, moved, deleted and new ones added by using the **Edit Sections** button. Sections without any results will not be listed in the search report.

Within a section, results can be ordered by: title, publisher, publication year and author.

Results can be moved between sections by selecting and using the **Move Selected Results**, or by manually dragging and dropping.

This encompasses general physical health assessment and monitoring for people with a mental health diagnosis. However the inclusion of specific physical conditions alongside this may also be appropriate, depending upon the user's role and depth of interest.
