KnowledgeShare is now using LibKey as its link resolver

Following the completion of the roll out of LibKey across NHS England, KnowledgeShare changed in early January from using Ovid as a link resolver and now uses LibKey.

LKS teams don't need to take any further action. Your members who receive current awareness emails should now find it easier to obtain the full text articles they have access rights to. The LibKey interface is intuitive and gives members instructions on how to access articles.

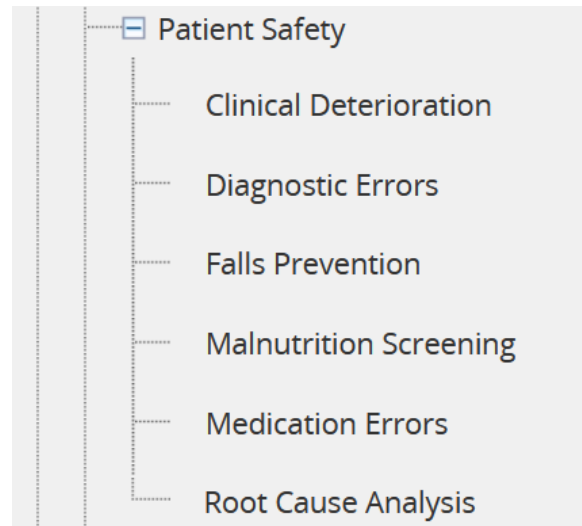


How do I categorise issues with the diagnosis of physical and mental health conditions?



A new category of **Diagnostic Errors** has recently been added under Patient Safety. Use this for:

- misdiagnosis
- under- and over-diagnosis
- diagnostic overshadowing
- diagnostic blind spots.



Do not use for diagnosis as a topic more broadly, or for specific diagnostic methods. Simply select the relevant condition and the appropriate staff group(s).
