Thank you for your recent request for information under the Freedom of Information (FOI) Act 2000.

We are now in a position to respond to your request.

## Your request:

- 1. What antenatal advice does the trust routinely give to mothers about infant skincare including the bathing of babies?
- 2. What postpartum advice does the trust routinely give to mothers about infant skincare including the bathing of babies?

## Our response:

Under Section 1(1)(a) of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), the Trust can confirm that it holds information relevant to your request and this has been provided where possible below.

Please note University Hospitals Sussex NHS Foundation Trust was formed on 1 April 2021, with the merger of Brighton and Sussex University Hospitals NHS Trust and Western Sussex Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust.

Please see below for information relevant to the Royal Sussex County and Princess Royal Hospitals

In these hospitals, Trust staff do not provide documentary information regarding skincare and bathing of newborn babies in either the ante- or post-natal period. However, parents are given verbal advice recommending that babies should not be bathed for the first 7 – 10 days after birth, and then only with plain water. Parents are also referred to the NHS website for further guidance, and given the following link; Washing and bathing your baby - NHS (www.nhs.uk)
