What to do when a member of library staff joins or leaves your team

Joining: A Staff record functions differently to a Member record, so a new LKS staff member cannot be added as you would add a member. To add someone to your team, you will need LKS Administrator level permissions.

- Under Admin, click on Add Staff
- 2. Fill in the required fields
- Check the box to allow an invitation email to be sent. This will send the staff member a unique link to connect to their account with OpenAthens.

Leaving: Work such as evidence searches and teaching are 'attached' to a Staff record so we recommend deleting LKS staff records and starting a fresh record when they move to a new service. In this way LKS staff don't take the work they have created to their new service and create errors in the statistical reports. To delete a Staff record, you will need LKS Administrator level permissions.

- 1. Make sure any members and incomplete searches assigned to the staff member have been transferred to other team members
- 2. On the Staff record page click on 'Edit' on the personal information section
- 3. Scroll to the bottom of the record
- 4. Click Delete. If you do not see a red Delete button, you may need to check your admin permissions.


