Parking

St Thomas' Hospital is located in the Congestion Charging zone https://tfl.gov.uk/modes/driving/congestion-charge and the Ultra Low Emission Zone (ULEZ). https://tfl.gov.uk/modes/driving/ultra-low-emission-zone

Parking is very limited at the hospital and there is often a queue. The car park is open 24 hours a day and costs £3.20 per hour.

Public transport (train)

Duration (from Brighton Station) – approximately 1.5 to 2 hours.

You will need to change at London Bridge, and alight the train to London Waterloo East.



Closest mainline stations – London Waterloo or London Waterloo East. Blackfriars station is a 25 minute walk away.

Closest tube stations are Waterloo which is a 15 minute walk, or Lambeth North, also a 15 minute walk, or Westminster, a 10 minute walk.

Help with transport and/or overnight stays


Guys and St Thomas' hospital can provide transport and also help with the cost of the travel for certain patient groups.

Parking

Visitors can use the pay-on-exit car park, accessible from Blackshaw Road. Disabled badge holders are permitted to park along the hospital's perimeter road. There are also on-road parking options in nearby streets.

Parking Costs: £2.50 per hour, £25 fixed daily rate over 8 hours.

Public transport

Duration from Brighton station is approximately 1.5 to 2 hours. No direct train but you can change at London Bridge, alighting on the train to Tooting mainline station. This is a 20 minute walk or a bus routes 44, 77, 264, 270, 280 and N44.

The closest tube station is Tooting Broadway which is a 10 minute walk from the station.

Help with transport

Unfortunately, there is no funding for travel or overnight stays.

Parking

Great Ormond Street Hospital does not have a car park.
The London Borough of Camden provide parking permits so that carers bringing children to GOSH can park their car nearby. Parking permits are available on the day of their use and can be collected from the main reception desk, which is located in the main entrance of GOSH

By public transport

The nearest stations are:

- Russell Square (Piccadilly Line) 7 minute walk.
- Holborn Station (Piccadilly and Central Lines) 8 minute walk.
- Euston (Underground and National Rail) 18 minute walk.
- Kings Cross (Underground, Overground and National Rail) 21 minute walk.

Help with transport

Hospital transport is available for patients who meet eligibility criteria (e.g., in a wheelchair, require specialised equipment or oxygen, immunocompromised).

Families on the NHS Low Income Scheme are eligible to receive a refund on travel through the Healthcare Travel Costs Scheme.

Accommodation: Patients outside of the M25 are entitled to request hospital accommodation.
